COMPLAINT FOR DAMAGES AND INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Plaintiffs Intel-GE Care Innovations LLC, Bonnie Norman, and Steve Backers file this Complaint for Damages and Injunctive Relief against Defendant James H. Morrison on personal knowledge as to their own activities and on information and belief as to the activities of others as follows:

I. NATURE OF THE CASE

- 1. This is an action to enjoin, and recover damages suffered as a result of Defendant Morrison's harassing, defamatory, and offensive conduct.
- 2. Morrison posted offensive pornographic content on an online website for owners and enthusiasts of Tesla electric cars. For that reason, the website managers banned Morrison from accessing the site.
- 3. Morrison mistakenly blames Plaintiff Bonnie Norman, who is a discussion moderator on that website, for his ban. But Norman had no involvement with Morrison's ban and, until the events described below, had no awareness of or relationship with

Morrison.

4. In an effort to harass Norman into restoring his access to the Tesla
enthusiast website, Morrison retaliated against Norman by contacting her using the online
social website Facebook and sending her a series of threatening and harassing messages.
In those messages, he threatened to "escalate the issue" and specifically threatened "the
escalation will be towards your professional career at Care Innovations." Plaintiff Intel-
GE Care Innovations LLC ("Care Innovations") is Norman's employer. Morrison warned
Norman that she could "expect a near term response that will have an impact on your
personal and professional life and future career prospects."

- 5. Care Innovations has no connection to Morrison or the website that banned him. Care Innovations is a partnership between two of the largest companies in the world—General Electric Company and Intel Corporation. Care Innovations offers products and services designed to help the sick and the elderly better manage their day-to-day care by connecting them with their care teams. By connecting patients to caregivers via technology, Care Innovations' products promote patient independence and safety and help providers keep costs down and better manage care.
- 6. After Morrison threatened to "escalate" his retaliation, he directed Norman to visit a website he created located at an Internet domain name consisting of the name of a member of Care Innovations' senior management, Plaintiff Steve Backers: http://www.stevebackers.com.
- 7. On that website, Morrison posted a statement falsely attributed to Norman that accused Backers of being a "dangerous child predator" and of possessing child pornography. Morrison also posted a photograph of Backers that he unlawfully copied from the Care Innovations corporate management website and used without permission. Morrison posted Backers' residential address and a statement—also falsely attributed by Norman—urging Backers' neighbors with small children to "take reasonable precautions". A copy of that website is attached as Exhibit A.
 - 8. Those accusations are baseless and have caused personal and professional

embarrassment and mental anguish to Backers. And the public attribution of these clearly false and disparaging statements to Norman has caused her personal and professional embarrassment and mental anguish.

- 9. At the same time that Morrison registered the <stevebackers.com> Internet domain name, he also registered Internet domain names consisting of the names of several other members of Care Innovations' senior management. Plaintiffs do not know what content Morrison intends to post on websites located at those domain names as part of his ongoing "retaliation" campaign.
- 10. Morrison's defamatory statements have already injured Plaintiffs, and if not enjoined, will continue to substantially and irreparably harm Plaintiffs.
- 11. Care Innovations takes Mr. Morrison's threatening behavior very seriously. Care Innovations' senior management has been diverted from normal business duties to spend time and resources addressing Morrison's serious threats and harmful conduct directed at the company and its employees. Other Care Innovations employees are deeply concerned that Morrison will target them next.
- 12. Plaintiffs file this lawsuit to recover damages and to enjoin Morrison from further unlawful conduct.

II. PARTIES

- 13. Defendant James H. Morrison is an individual who resides in King County, Washington.
 - 14. Plaintiff Bonnie Norman is a California resident.
 - 15. Plaintiff Steve Backers is a California resident.
- 16. Plaintiff Intel-GE Care Innovations LLC is a Delaware limited liability company with its principal place of business in Roseville, California. Care Innovations markets and provides healthcare services to consumers throughout the United States, including in Washington.

III. JURISDICTION AND VENUE

17. This Court has original jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action

pursuant to RCW § 2.08.010.

- 18. This Court has personal jurisdiction over Morrison because he resides in King County, Washington, and is therefore subject to general jurisdiction in this Court.
- 19. Additionally, this Court has personal jurisdiction over Morrison under Washington's long arm statute, RCW 4.28.185(b) because Morrison committed the tortious acts complained of herein in Washington.
- 20. Venue is proper in King County pursuant to RCW § 4.12.025(3)(a) because Morrison committed the tortious acts complained of herein in King County.

IV. FACTS

- 21. James Morrison was a registered user on the Tesla Motors Club website located at <www.teslamotorsclub.com> (the "TMC Website"). The TMC Website provides an online forum for Tesla electric-car owners and enthusiasts to exchange ideas, news, and information.
- 22. Morrison's TMC Website account was recently permanently blocked because the TMC Website's owners received repeated complaints about Morrison from other users of the TMC Website.
- 23. Morrison posted links to offensive pornographic material on the TMC Website, which upset other users.
- 24. Plaintiff Bonnie Norman is a forum moderator for the TMC Website. She is also the Director of Quality and Regulatory Affairs at Plaintiff Care Innovations. Care Innovations offers products and services designed to help the sick and the elderly better manage their day-to-day care. Care Innovations has no affiliation or connection with the TMC Website or Morrison.
- 25. On October 27, 2013, Morrison contacted Norman by sending her a private message on the Facebook social networking website. At first, Norman did not know who Morrison was, or how he found her Facebook account.
- 26. Morrison accused Norman of frivolously banning his TMC Website account and told her that he would be "escalating the issue" and specifically that "the

escalation will be towards your professional career at Care Innovations."

- 27. But Norman did not ban Morrison from the TMC Website, and had no authority to do so.
- 28. Morrison also wrote that Norman had "a limited amount of time (days) to correct your mistake" or he would retaliate "in a manner that will have an impact on your personal and professional reputation." Morrison included a link to Care Innovations' website, confirming his intention to attempt to harm Norman and her employer.
- Norman responded to Morrison that she did not have any authority to ban
 TMC Website accounts.
- 30. Morrison responded by telling Norman to "drop the stupid act" and repeated his threats of retaliation.
- 31. Morrison wrote: "There will be no more responses. Escalation is happening. Goodbye." Morrison specifically warned Norman that she could "expect a near term response that will have an impact on your personal and professional life and future career prospects."
- 32. When Norman asked Morrison to stop bullying and threatening her, Morrison responded that he also planned to "escalate" against other people connected to the TMC Website. He said that his "next trip to the Los Angeles region will include a visit" to the TMC Website owner's home, and provided the residential address.
- 33. On October 28, 2013, Morrison sent a final message to Norman consisting only of an address for an online website he had created at www.stevebackers.com.
- 34. Steve Backers is employed by Care Innovations as its Director of Human Resources, a senior management position.
- 35. On that website, Morrison posted a picture of Backers taken from his profile on Care Innovations' website at http://www.careinnovations.com/about-us/management-team.
- 36. Morrison's website also includes alarming and false statements accusing Backers of being a "child predator" and of possessing child pornography and publishing

- 42. Plaintiffs do not know how many other domain names Morrison has registered in connection with his retaliation campaign.
- 43. Norman has been seriously alarmed, annoyed and harassed by Morrison's threatening messages, his attempts to extort her, his promise to "escalate" matters, the creation and publication of the website with false accusations of criminal activity against Backers that are falsely attributed to Norman, and the registration of domain names corresponding to other Care Innovations employees.
- 44. Norman fears for her safety as a result of Morrison's actions. Norman's neighbors have posted signs warning the community about Morrison's threats and urging them to report any suspicious activity. Norman's neighbors also check her home to confirm it is safe before letting Norman enter.
- 45. Backers also is distressed by Morrison's actions. Backers was shocked and embarrassed to find that Morrison had created and published a website located at a domain name consisting of his name and featuring his picture that falsely represents that he is a child predator and in possession of child pornography, which is a serious crime.
- 46. Plaintiffs are concerned that Morrison will use other domain names he has registered to post false, defamatory, and inflammatory statements about them and other Care Innovations employees.
- 47. Following the advice of security experts, Care Innovations has hired a security guard to monitor its business premises during business hours and to escort Norman to and from her car when she arrives and departs from work. The presence of onsite security and other repercussions caused by Morrison's conduct have caused Care Innovations employees to worry, become distracted, and be less productive.
- 48. Morrison's conduct has caused significant disruption to Care Innovations' business. If Care Innovations' executives and senior management, including those which Morrison has already targeted and those which he apparently intends to target, are falsely accused of criminal and immoral activity—Care Innovations' business reputation will be

Plaintiffs incorporate by reference Paragraphs 1 through 55 above as

- 57. Morrison's conduct was and is extreme, outrageous, and utterly intolerable in a civilized community.
- 58. Morrison knew or should have known that the publication of false and misleading statements about Backers and Norman would cause severe emotional distress to Backers and Norman.
- 59. Backers and Norman have incurred significant emotional distress and anguish as a result of Morrison's conduct.
- 60. Backers and Norman have suffered and continue to suffer harm because of Morrison's wrongful conduct that is likely to continue until Morrison's conduct is enjoined.
- 61. As a direct, proximate, and foreseeable result of Morrison's activities, Backers and Norman have been damaged in an amount to be determined at trial.

VII. THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION

Invasion of Privacy (False Light)

By Plaintiffs Backers and Norman

- 62. Plaintiffs incorporate by reference Paragraphs 1 through 61 above as though fully set forth herein.
- 63. Morrison widely published materially false information concerning Backers and Norman. On a publicly-available website, he posted false statements that Backers is a "dangerous child predator" and possesses child pornography. And on that website, Morrison knowingly attributed those false accusations to Norman.
- 64. The false light in which Morrison has placed Backers and Norman is highly offensive to Backers and Norman and would be highly offensive to any reasonable person.
- 65. Morrison knew of, or recklessly disregarded, the falsity of his statements concerning Backers and Norman and the false light in which they would be placed.
- 66. Backers and Norman have incurred significant emotional distress as a result of Morrison's false and misleading statements.
